Dear Mr. Hardy,

I am in receipt of your letter dated August 12, 2014, purportedly in response to my letter dated July 15, 2014. Your letter does not address any of the issues raised in my July 15, 2014 letter and, rather than answering any inquiry, simply raises more questions. I still have no idea what reference number NFP-33408 is or relates to, if anything. That is the reference number on your letter dated May 30, 2014. Now, in the August 12 correspondence, a new reference number is used, FOIPA Request No. 1288395-0, inexplicably listing as its subject "UNABOM INVESTIGATION; JAMES LUTCHER NEGLEY"

The only outstanding FOIPA request made by Mr. Negley was made on April 7, 2014 and directed to the Executive Office for United States Attorneys. It is assigned FOIPA Request No. FOIA-2014-02987, per e-mail correspondence from Susan Gerson, Assistant Director, forwarded from Danita Taylor (USAEO) on July 7, 2014.

I do not understand your August 12, 2014 Correspondence. I do not understand what, if any, request it may relate to. While the letter does refer to Mr. Negley's April 7, 2014 request, it does not respond to it. In fact, the April 7, 2014 request by Mr. Negley is not addressed to the FBI. I do not understand why the FBI has sent a letter referring to that request clearly directed to a different agency.


Your statement in the letter alleging that the handwritten notation which is the subject of Mr. Negley's April 7, 2014 request to a different agency is unbelievable in light of facts in the public record. Your claim that the reference in question (to 500,000 pp. and/or 42,000 miss) is to the UNABOM investigation cannot be correct. On page 346 of the book "Unabomber" by Jim Freeman, Terry D. Turchie, and Donald Max Noel,

published by History Publishing Company, it states "During its lifetime, the UTF investigated over 2,400 suspects, assembled 3,600 volumes of case files representing almost 18 years of investigation, compiled 82 million data records, gathered 8,182 items of physical evidence, and over 22,000 pages of evidentiary documents. Kerry and Max had obviously found grist for their mill--the Massively Parallel Processor."

82 million data records. The breadth of the UNABOM file clearly goes far beyond the comparatively small numbers referenced in the U.S. Attorney's office fax that is the subject of Mr. Negley's April 7, 2014 request. Your letter is not proper under FOIA. It is not a response to Mr. Negley's April 7, 2014 FOIA request to the EOUSA. It does not assist Mr. Negley in his request under FOIA. Mr. Negley does not want the FBI to make an unsolicited copy of some part or all of the UNABOM file. Your August 12, 2014 letter is, effectively, a nullity.
