Re: Please Do Not Confirm Robert L. Pitman as Federal Judge

In light of the Senate Intelligence Committee's findings released last week, I urge you to look closely at the record of Robert L. Pitman and I ask you ***not*** to confirm his nomination for Federal Judge of the Western District of Texas.

Mr. Pitman served as a U.S. Attorney in 2001. On September 11, 2001, he formed an anti-terrorism task force in the Western District of Texas. This task force united local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies to include the Federal Bureau of Investigation in counter-terrorism efforts and to better secure Texas' international border. I believe there is evidence that he has been responsible for "no touch torture" of many Americans and cannot be trusted to uphold the laws of this country as a federal judge.

The tactics of "no touch torture" or "gang stalking" or "organized stalking" or the Stasi tactic of "Zersetzung" include: "sensory disorientation" and "self-inflicted pain." In theory, the combination of these tactics cause victims to deteriorate psychologically, feel responsible for their own suffering and cause them to capitulate more readily to their torturers (see University of Wisconsin professor Alfred McCoy's 2006 book, *A Question of Torture, CIA Interrogation, from the Cold War to the War on Terror*). In 2004, the Red Cross reported: "The construction of such a system. ... cannot be considered anything other than an intentional system of cruel, unusual and degrading treatment and a form of torture." These practices are clearly illegal in all 50 states and violate the U.S. Constitution.

Further evidence exists that Mr. Pitman was involved in this type of activity is indicated in a massive FBI file of 500,000 pages, detailing many instances of "gang stalking" perpetrated by the FBI. Similarly, there are 42,000 pages of evidence that is referenced in a January 22, 2002 letter from David M. Castillo, Assistant U.S. Attorney, U.S. Attorney's Office, Western District of Texas, Austin, Texas to the Chief Counsel, Sacramento Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Sacramento, California.

I ask you again ***not*** to confirm Robert L. Pitman until you have looked closely into all of these matters.
