(b)(6)-5, 6 & [redacted] Referenced teletype furnished information from a [redacted] interview regarding [redacted] who was described as (b)(7)(C)-5, 6 having personal characteristics who could fit the UNABOM subject. This was based on the [redacted] interview and [redacted] past occupation as a [redacted]

(b)(6)-6 & (b)(7)(C)-6 However, given [redacted] lengthy term of residence in up-state New York, this information lacks specific proximity to other UNABOM events and [redacted] himself (he is currently 66) and is outside the age range normally being considered for the UNABOM subject.

(b)(6)-6 & (b)(7)(C)-6 [redacted] has been fully identified, and the information provided does not meet the predication to initiate a specific suspect investigation. Unless new information is developed regarding [redacted] this will remain unassigned in a suspect dead file. Buffalo Division will be advised separately by UTF regarding this.

Synopsis: Lead coverage involving JAMES NEGLEY, who entered the CHICO STATE LIBRARY with urgent request for Washington Post article relating to UNABOM. Contact made on 9/19/95.

Reference: Lead Number SC1043; Event Record 8297.

Details: On 9/19/95, contact was made with Sergeant [redacted] (b)(7)(C)-3
CHICO STATE UNIVERSITY POLICE, relating to a student having entered their office and furnishing information relating to a JAMES NEGLEY, who was frantically seeking a copy of the Washington Post article relating to UNABOM.

On the evening of 9/19/95, contact was made with [redacted] (b)(7)(C)-2,3,5
[redacted] telephone number [redacted] and he verified that he is [redacted] and a student at CHICO STATE UNIVERSITY. He stated that on 9/19/95, at approximately 5:45 p.m., he noticed an individual having a conversation with [redacted] [redacted] in the CHICO STATE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY.

The individual wanted to photocopy the Washington Post newspaper which contained a 35,000 word article on a bombing. (b)(7)(C)-2,3,5
The individual offered [redacted] \$20 to get the article copied and deliver it to the HOLIDAY INN in Chico, where he stated he was staying. The individual furnished [redacted] a business card and was adamant that he needed the article as soon as possible. The name on the business card was JAMES LUTCHER NEGLEY, 3985 Laguna Vista Cove, Austin, Texas. The business card also had a fax

number and a separate telephone number on it.

[redacted] described the individual as a white male, in his late forties, 5'10" to 6' tall, 195 to 215 pounds, curly brown short hair, light colored eyes, with wire framed glasses.

(b)(7)(C)-2

On the same date, [redacted] age 27, was contacted at her place of employment, the CHICO STATE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY, and verified that earlier that evening, at approximately 5:45 p.m., she had been approached by an individual who wanted to obtain a copy of the Washington Post which contained an article relating to the Unabomber. [redacted] told the individual that it takes one to two days after an article comes out of the Washington Post for the University to obtain that newspaper, and consequently any newspaper dated the 19th would not be available to the Library until either the 20th or the 21st. The individual was very firm in his desire to obtain the article as soon as possible, and offered [redacted] \$20 to photocopy the article and deliver it to the hotel in Chico, the HOLIDAY INN, where he was currently residing. [redacted] stated that she subsequently turned around to lay something back on a table adjacent to her and when she turned back around toward the individual, he had disappeared.

(b)(7)(C)-2,3,5

[redacted] described the individual much in the same manner that [redacted] had described him.

Subsequent to the above-mentioned interviews, JAMES LUTCHER NEGLEY was interviewed at the HOLIDAY INN, Chico, California, during the early morning hours of 9/20/95. The context of that interview will be documented by a second Special Agent who was the lead interviewer ([redacted]).

JAMES LUTCHER NEGLEY, date of birth: FRCP 5.2/L.R. 5:4(f)(3) was interviewed at the HOLIDAY INN, 685 Manzanita Court, Chico, California, on September 20, 1995. NEGLEY was advised that he was being contacted due to his request for a copy of the UNABOMer manuscript from the CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY CHICO, California, library.

NEGLEY was cooperative throughout the interview and advised that he was interested in the manuscript due to his involvement in photovoltaic cell work and research at his Golden, Colorado, office. His company, DAVIS, JOSEPH AND NEGLEY is applying for a patent and planning to advertise, however, due to the UNABOMer's anti-technology/industrial stance, he wonders if it is wise to advertise. NEGLEY's bottom-line concern/interest is being considered a possible UNABOM target due to his involvement in "high tech" work. He was concerned that there would be a WASHINGTON POST copy available when he returned to Austin, Texas, so he attempted to obtain one at the UNIVERSITY OF CHICO library.

NEGLEY advised that he was in the Chico area checking on his 140 acre almond orchard investment. He stated he made the investment several years ago and tries to go to Chico at least once a year to check on his investment. NEGLEY did say it was an outstanding investment.

NEGLEY stated he currently resides at 3905 Laguna Vista Lane in Austin, Texas 78746. He frequently travels between there and Golden, Colorado. His address and telephone number in Colorado is 14062 Denver West Parkway #130, Golden, Colorado 80901.

NEGLEY has also recently traveled to Uruguay, South America, where he is in a joint venture/business with another individual. They have opened a doughnut shop in Uruguay.

NEGLEY inherited a large sum of money several years ago and has invested it in several areas such as those mentioned above. He stated that a large part of his income is from oil and gas which led to his interest in photovoltaic cells which are all part of the energy industry.

NEGLEY attended college at the UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS at Austin where he took general education courses and never graduated. He attended a university in New Jersey and one in Mexico City, Mexico, as well but has never earned a degree. After receiving his inheritance, he became an entrepreneur and has done well for himself.

NEGLEY enlisted in the United States Army in the late 1960's and did one tour in Vietnam during his three-year enlistment. NEGLEY's Regular Army number was RA18752998.

NEGLEY advised that he has no ties to the Chicago, Illinois, or Salt Lake City, Utah, area. He has frequented the San Francisco, California, area in the past.

NEGLEY was cooperative throughout the interview and concerned that he had upset the people at the library. He left his address and telephone numbers where he could be reached if needed in the future.

A check of Lexis/Nexis revealed DAVIS, JOSEPH AND NEGLEY incorporated in the state of California on April 25, 1988, and suspended August 1, 1995, with a mailing address of 14062 Denver West Parkway, #130, Golden, Colorado 80401, the same address provided by the interviewing agents.

Dear Chief:

This is to advise you of the results of investigation conducted by the UNABOM Task Force at Sacramento, California, in connection with information provided by officers of your department on September 19, 1995. On that date, a complaint was received by your department regarding a suspicious individual at the university's library who was attempting to obtain a copy of the Washington Post's article concerning the UNABOMer. Your department immediately notified the UNABOM Task Force and assisted agents of this office in successfully resolving the matter.

The individual was identified as James Lucher Negley, date of birth FRCP 5.2/L.R, 5.4(f)(3) residing in Austin, Texas. He was interviewed by agents of this office and deemed not to be a viable UNABOM suspect. He was, apparently, interested only in obtaining a copy of the article for personal reasons.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank and commend Sergeant [redacted] and his officers who assisted in obtaining and providing necessary background information as well as conducting some on-site investigation on a timely basis since our closest agent was an hour and a half away. The assistance of your department played a pivotal role in the successful conclusion of this matter.

Synopsis: To summarize investigation conducted regarding attempts by James Lutcher Negley to obtain a copy of the UNABOM manuscript at the California State University at Chico Library on 9/19/95.

Reference: Numerous telephone calls between SAC Richard Ross, ASAC Terry Turchie, and SSA's [redacted] and [redacted] on 9/19 and 9/20/95.

(b)(7)(C)-1

Enclosures: One copy each of CLETS print-outs of drivers, auto and criminal history checks conducted, Butte Information Technology Center report, and one copy of California State University (CSUC) at Chico Police Report all concerning Negley.

Details: Pursuant to a call to the UNABOM 1-800 Hot Line at San Francisco, California, contact was made with CSUC Campus Police

[redacted] at CSUC, telephone number

(b)(7)(C)-3

[redacted] Clark advised that on this date his department received a complaint that one James Lutcher Negley had been in contact with two employees of the library on campus and attempted to obtain a WASHINGTON POST newspaper which contained an article

on "the bomber". Upon being advised that the newspaper was not available for checkout or to be taken by anyone, he asked if it could be copied. Upon an affirmative answer, he offered \$20 to the employee requesting that the entire 35,000 word manuscript be copied and delivered to him at his hotel room in the Holiday Inn in Chico. Upon checking, the library staff advised Negley that

the paper was not available and would not be delivered for one or two days. He then reiterated his desire to have the entire manuscript copied and delivered to his room. While the employees were debating whether they could comply with his request, he simply left the library unobserved by them.

One of those employees, [redacted] Chico, California, telephone number [redacted] filed a report concerning the above. He advised that Negley had approached another employee, [redacted] who was then on duty at the library.

(b)(7)(C)-2, 3, 5

[redacted] arranged for an unmarked and plain clothes officer to make a contact with the night manager at the Holiday Inn. That officer confirmed that Negley was registered at the motel; checking in 9/18/95 with a scheduled checkout of 9/21/95. Negley listed home address of 3905 Laguna Vista Cover, Austin, Texas 78746, with telephone numbers 512/328-76890, and facsimile number 512/328-0486. Negley paid for the hotel using a VISA credit card, account # [redacted] in his name.

(b)(7)(C)-3

Interviews were conducted of both Negley and [redacted] by Special Agent [redacted]. Both individuals related essentially the same facts as provided to the Police Department by [redacted]. Agents of the Sacramento Division were dispatched to Chico, California, to surveil Negley and attempt an interview of him on 9/20/95.

(b)(7)(C)-1,2,3, 5

In the interim, records checks enclosed were conducted. It was determined that Negley had no criminal record and had no wants or warrants. He holds a Texas driver's license. He has no autos registered to him in California, Illinois, Utah, Colorado, or Texas. He did have a 1983 Mercedes Benz registered to him in California, under California license 2DXP363 at 3905 Laguna Vista Cove, Austin City, Texas. That license expired 4/24/91.

Negley was identified as having Social Security Account Number [redacted] issued in Texas in 1962. Social Security checks through credit services identified him with an address in

Golden, Colorado in May 1994, in San Antonio, Texas, December 1989, and Austin, Texas, in May 1990, with a most current address of April 1995 at the Laguna Vista Cove address.

A Metronet On-Line Information Systems address check associated Negley with the Laguna Vista Cove address in Austin but indicated a change of address to 14062 Denver Parkway West, Golden, Colorado, apparent effective date not indicated.

3905 Laguna Vista Cove is identified by Lexis/Nexis as a single family dwelling having an estimated total assessed value of \$307,573.

Lexis/Nexis identified a state of California state tax lien of \$14,976 filed 12/21/94 and cleared 3/27/95. That judgment was entered at Sacramento County Court under record #94-12210373. It was cleared under file #95-03270700. Telephone checks for the home and facsimile numbers as provided on Negley's business card were negative in records checks conducted of Metro On-Line Information Systems.

Telephonic contact with night personnel at San Antonio Field Office determined that there were no criminal record or other records of contacts with Negley in local records.

Negley was interviewed on 9/20/95. He fully identified himself and provided information identical to that provided above and below in the descriptive section of this communication.

Negley advised that he was in Chico to conduct personal business relating to some property owned by him in the immediate area. He is an entrepreneur and company owner who is involved in the research and development of the photovoltaic cell field. His company is located in Golden, Colorado, and is known as Davis, Joseph and Negley. That company is applying for a patent and planning to advertise any new developments and/or products. Negley advised that due to the UNABOMer's anti-technology stance, he wondered if it were wise to involve himself in that advertisement. He expressed concern that he might be considered a possible UNABOM target because of his involvement in this high tech work.

Negley advised that since he was traveling away from home he would be unable to obtain a copy of the UNABOM manuscript prior to his return to Austin, Texas. That was the reason he attempted to obtain a copy of the paper from the CSUC library.

Negley was interviewed regarding his background in relation to UNABOM protocol. He advised that he has recently traveled to Uruguay, South America, where he is involved in a joint venture with another individual. This is a doughnut shop. Negley inherited a large sum of money several years ago and has used those funds to invest in several businesses and enterprises. A large part of his income is from oil and gas investments which led to his interest in the photovoltaic cells since they are part of the energy industry.

Negley attended college at the University of Texas at Austin majoring in general Education courses. He never graduated. He also attended college in New Jersey and in Mexico City but did not earn degrees in either location. Once receiving his inheritance, he ceased going to school and considers himself as having done well.

Negley enlisted in the United States Army in the late 1960's and did a tour of Vietnam during his three year enlistment. His Regular Army number was RA18752998.

Negley has frequented the San Francisco area in the past but has no ties to the Chicago or Salt Lake areas.

Negley was cooperative throughout the interview and was concerned that he had upset people at the CSUC library. He provided the interviewing agents with addresses and telephone numbers where he could be contacted in the future.

In the opinion of the interviewing agents, Negley did not resemble the UNABOM composite and is a much larger individual than listed in the composite description.

Details: JAMES LUTCHER NEGLEY, date of birth: ^{FRCP 5.2/L.R. 5.4(f)(3)} [REDACTED], became a possible Unabom suspect on 9/19/95 when [REDACTED] of the CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY at CHICO POLICE DEPARTMENT contacted the Unabom Hot Line in San Francisco, and advised that an individual that looked like the Unabomber had entered the Meriam Library on the Chico Campus at approximately 6 p.m., asking a young girl who works at the Library to get him a copy of the 35-page manifesto from The Washington Post. In addition, he asked her to make copies for him and offered \$20 for her to do the job. NEGLEY advised that he was staying at the Holiday Inn in Chico, and left his business card with the female, asking that a copy of the manifesto from The Washington Post be delivered to [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-3

the hotel if possible.

That same evening, the writer was dispatched to Chico, California, where he met SA [redacted] in Chico. The writer and SA [redacted] subsequently interviewed NEGLEY, the results of which are reflected on the enclosed investigative insert.

Additional details regarding the investigation of NEGLEY are enclosed with this EC.

Inasmuch as no further investigation is warranted at this time, and that NEGLEY should not be considered a viable Unabom suspect, it is recommended that this lead be considered covered at this time.
